

Contribution of the authors is the following: prof. dr. Uros V. Suvakovic has established, from the aspect of sociology of medicine, the connection between the problem of globalization, formulation of planetary (global) social goals and progress of the globalization process that have led both to the outbreak of smallpox epidemic in Yugoslavia in 1972 and its eradication in the world in 1980; prof. dr. Stevan Z. Baljosevic, as infectologist and participant in the action of smallpox suppression in Yugoslavia in 1972, at Kosovo and Metohija, has elaborated the historical-medical aspect of this epidemic with us, as well as certain characteristics of the disease in general, recognized the form of smallpox and signed previously unpublished photographs made during the Yugoslav epidemic in 1972 by the late prof. dr. med sci Vojislav Suvakovic (1925-2010), which are now the property of his son Uros, one of the co-authors of the paper; prof. dr. Zarko V. Obradovic has analyzed the failures of the state administration in epidemic protection that made contribution to the outburst of the last European epidemic of this disease.
